Samples required for prior information regarding Hazardous materials

According to Article 572 of Commercial Code (Amended 2019), Hazardous materials* shall be notified to the carrier for safe transportations. Therefore, JFRL asks to the clients to inform us whether the sample corresponds to a hazardous material, and if applicable, <u>describe this in the request form or Bunsekinavi@jfrl, and SDSs are required for submission when shipping the samples.</u>

Depending on the type and quantity of hazardous materials, transportation may take time and thus this may affect to the turnaround time.

*: Hazardous materials are those that are regulated for transportation by laws such as Fire Service Act, High Pressure Gas Safety Act, Poisonous and Deleterious Substances Control Act, and Civil Aeronautics Act(Domestic Transportation). In particular, the following GHS markings on SDS, etc. may indicate hazardous materials in transportation.
